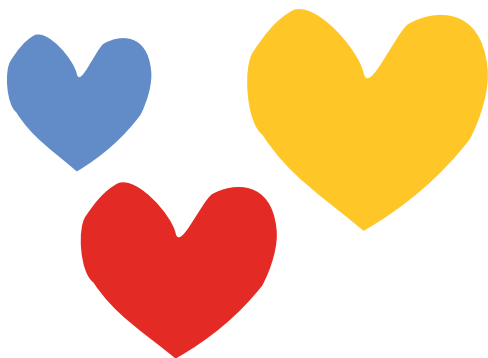


# Your Impact in 2024

When baby Thatcher was diagnosed with stage four neuroblastoma, the Stephens family faced unthinkable challenges like an 8-hour journey to Vancouver, months of treatment far from home, the fear of being separated during Thatcher's first Christmas. Thanks to Ronald McDonald House BC & Yukon, the Stephens found a place where they could stay together, surrounded by comfort, community, and care. Over six months, the House became their home, making it possible to focus on what mattered most: Thatcher's recovery.

## RMH BC & Yukon

enables critical access to health care for families as an essential partner to the paediatric health care system.



RMH BC & Yukon served **627** unique families with **148** of those families requiring two or more stays. **141** families stayed two or more times each year. The most stays by one family in 2024 was **12** stays.



The healing power of being together at RMH BC & Yukon with family: in 2024, **361** healthy siblings were able to stay close to their brother or sister who was in the hospital.

Last year, the Ronald McDonald Family Room at Surrey Memorial Hospital had **15,784** drop-ins from families and caregivers. The room also served **2290** meals, **1203** snack bags and over **1200** loads of laundry.



Our Ronald McDonald Family Room in Surrey served **79** families with the longest stay of 74 nights in 2024.



We've been cooking up something special with our NEW Chef-led meal program that empowers corporate and community groups to prepare meals for families. Over the course of **195** meal service days, we whipped up a total of **63,606** meals and **5,240** grab-and-go bags.

Your generous contribution strengthens family bonds during difficult times, providing a supportive environment that fosters holistic healing and is instrumental in a child's recovery process.



A 2023 RBC Economic Impact Study revealed that RMH BC & Yukon saves families **\$8.4M** annually in out-of-pocket expenses such as food, lodging, and other essentials.



Our Medical Play program was recognized as a *RMHC Global Award* finalist! The program helps children navigate medical experiences with play. In 2024, we provided **254** hours to **174** patients, **309** siblings and **165** adults,



Staying at RMH BC & Yukon offers not only a sense of community but also relief from social isolation for sick children and their families. Families have access to a variety of Wellness Programs, including Music Therapy, Art Therapy, Medical Play, Massage Therapy, and Pet Therapy, designed to support patients, siblings, and caregivers alike.



RMH BC's Music Therapy has truly been making a difference since 2015. In 2024, **Certified Music Therapist Erin Parr led over 540 hours** of sing-a-longs, instrument play and even a spontaneous dad's Rockband session!

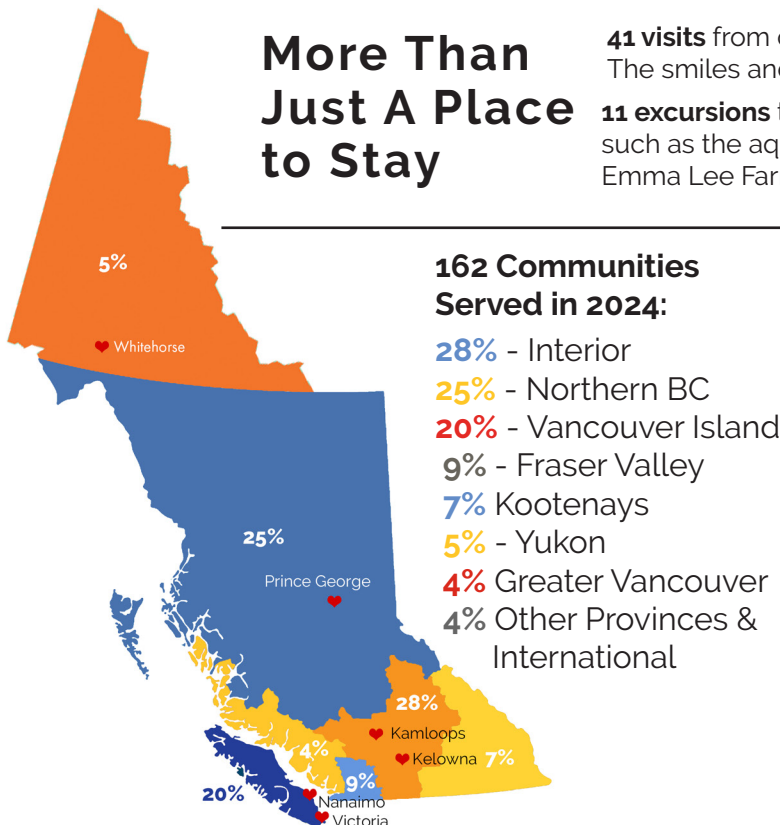
